


This will be a time to celebrate the history of Mount Olivet Cemetery, and to honor the more than 36,000 people who are interred on this consecrated land.

About Mount Olivet Cemetery

Established in 1874 by President Ulysses S. Grant, Mount Olivet is the only cemetery in the United States to be created by an Act of Congress. It was designed as a non-profit public burial place for all people, with perpetual stewardship by a volunteer Board of Trustees that is comprised of one lay and one clergy representative from Baptist, Congregational, Episcopal, Methodist, and Presbyterian denominations.

Framed by the majestic Wasatch Mountains, the lovely pathways and gardens create a space for beginning: A place of burial where the spirit is honored and cared for. Located on 500 South, across from the University of Utah's Rice-Eccles Stadium, Mount Olivet Cemetery is one of Utah's most picturesque cemeteries with an amazing mountain backdrop. It is popular with both wildlife and runners year-round.



Mount Olivet Cemetery continues to provide affordable single or family lots with monument privileges, single graves and cremation graves.
